INTRODUCTION

SPECIFIC DUTIES

- Helps minimize impact on the land by teaching fellow troop members the principles of Leave No Trace
- Help to improve fellow Scouts' outdoor ethics and decision-making skills.
- Prior to accepting the position, must successfully complete the official BSA 16 hour Leave No Trace Trainer training course.
- Must be 14 years or older.
- Set a good example.
- Wear the Scout uniform correctly.
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Show and help develop Scout spirit.
